POENB Meeting Minutes of August 6th, 2021:

Our POENB meeting was held outside at Valley Grove and began approximately 7:40 PM. All attendees turned toward the flag pole situated on the Andriano property and recited the Pledge of Allegiance.

Minutes (Readings and Update):

A motion was raised to accept the minutes of our July meeting as printed in the changing tides. The motion was seconded and approved.

Membership in attendance:

There were 22 members in attendance.



Correspondence:

A member wrote to the board to inquire about his parking sticker. Another member wrote to ask if he could pass along his membership to the new owner of his house. The board agreed & wished him well.

Frank P updated the membership on our ongoing communication with Peter Linderoth from Save the Sound. Several of the board members met with Peter via zoom earlier this month. They are working with us to help identify the reason for Valley Grove's poor water quality grades. We furnished GPS coordinates of Eatons Neck's three (3) street water run-off pipes. They will be taking water samples during dry weather and after sig-

nificant rainfalls and compiling other data to help us determine possible root route causes.

They offered us training on taking samples and we are encouraged by their willingness to help. Frank spoke with senator Gaughran about possible funding avenues to pursue. We are also looking to invite local candidates to our October meeting, more to come.

A member asked the Sound and their scope of services. Ryan elaborated on the Save the Sound zoom call. Based on their experience, old leaching septic systems seem to be a likely source



of the water quality issues. In addi-

tion to obtaining the GPS coordinates of the storm water outflows, the board has been busy following up on their other requests - namely requesting obtaining the Town of Huntington's storm water map. Ryan continues to work on this. (note: as of the publishing of these minutes we have made two calls to and spoken with an assistant of Highway Superintendent Orelli. His staff assures us he is looking into obtaining the storm water maps and may be interfacing with TOH Maritime Department to do so. As of this writing we have not yet received a call back from the Superintendent himself).

Ultimately, we are hopeful of drawing the attention of our __ elected officials and

coming up with actionable plans which can receive local town and federal funding. Save the Sound will help with discovery and they also offer sug-

gestions & solutions. Julie noted

the importance of getting in front of the new ToH supervisor & staff which will include at least three (3) new town board members.

Ryan read Peter Linderoth's email:

"Hello Frank (Pasquale),

It was great talking with you all; sorry for the delayed response on my end! Thank you for sending over the locations. We are going to plan some sampling at low tides as discussed and will share those results with you.

A couple other items as follow up from the call I believe are below:

1)I am going to try and obtain the times of sampling from Suffolk County DOH for a tide analysis

2) You were all going to try and obtain the dye testing

Handing this list to the Emergency Medical Technician will assist the EMT in diagnosing and treating the patient's condition. Calls for emergency medical help are usually tense, emotional times. Having a list of prescriptions on hand will alleviate some tension. Please place this list on the refrigerator or near the telephone.

The 2021 July 4th parade and picnic marked the 50th anniversary of this unique community celebration and was hosted jointly by the Property Owners of Eaton's Neck Beach and the Eaton's Neck Fire Department. The resumption of the celebration after the Covid shutdown of 2020 was a welcome event for the community. Town of Huntington fire departments participated, antique cars rolled along following the United States Coast Guard Color Guard and local dignitaries. The picnic which followed was well attended. Hot dogs, hamburgers, ice cream, soda and some beer were happily consumed. The end of the festivities was marked by the drawing of the winner of the fifty-fifty contest. The winner this year was a Centerport Fire Department member. Congratulations!

Preparation is an important word at this time of year, the hurricane season. Weather forecasters have been predicting that 2021 will "have marked tropical activity". Eaton's Neck is unique and beautiful. However, in the event of a storm it can be isolated. Preparation for power outages should be "made ready for". There are numerous websites with suggestions for plans for hurricane preparation, please select the one that meets your needs. Stay safe, stay well. If you need help dial 9 1 1.

4)You mentioned you are all aware of the incentives offered for upgrading onsite treatment facilities but I will send some over again shortly and we will plan to present the benefits of them at the community meeting if that works for you".


A member offered that they are currently engaged in the design phase of this program. A brief exchanged ensued about their experience thus far.



As we were holding this meeting at Valley Grove, member spoke up to express frustration that the western shore sand issue remains completely unanswered by our current elected officials. Julie & Ryan agreed and then offered a bit of history for new Neck residents. When one looks at a map of Eaton's Neck, the "hook" one sees at the top of our peninsula is not natural. In fact, maps of the late 1800s show no hook, just a rounded curve of healthy sand as it drifted naturally from Asharoken, around the top of Eaton's Neck and then south toward Huntington Bay, adding more length to the "point' at Hobart Beach each year. This natural process is called littoral drift and generally occurs on healthy beaches where the sand is flowing uninterrupted.

The hook we see atop Eaton's Neck is actually an unnatural cut into our west shoreline, perpetuated over 100 years—first by sand mining operations and more recently by the US Coast Guard who use that cut in the beach as the entry way to Coast Guard Cove where they keep their boats.

The Coast Guard must dredge annually to keep the basin operational which is good for marine safety, but bad for the beach which has had its natural flow of sand stopped. One way to make the situation better would be to take the dredged sand and drop it at various points along west beach each year, south of the inlet, to try to restore the beach back to a better sate of health.



For years, POENB has lobbied the Town of Huntington and public officials to advocate for our beach and establish a fair system of sand rotation with the US Coast Guard. Our requests have always been met with a brief moment of interest followed by inactivity

The unit that dredges the sand out of the Eaton's Neck Coat Guard basin every year is the Coast Guard Engineering unit out of Rhode Island. For the past six years or so, instead of placing the dredged sand on the beach south of the inlet where it can do some good, the Coast Guard has opted to keep the sand for themselves, which is their right, and place it on Coat Guard Property. Unfortunately, while sand placement at the station (north of the inlet) may provide some temporary erosion buffering, it does nothing long-term to replenish the sand starved beach south of the station where Valley Grove and other POENB residents are located. Further, dredged sand placed north of the inlet flows right back into the inlet from which it was dredged due to the process of littoral drift.

POENB has been advised that the sand being dredged is "owned" by the owner of Beacon Farms upon whose property the Coast Guard sits. Attempts to communicate with this person have been attempted many times, unsuccessfully. POENB sympathizes with all residents of Eaton's Neck and particularly land owners along west beach who have been left eroded. We will continue to make old and new Neck residents aware of this problem and encourage all to reach out to their public officials and urge them do advocate on

behalf of our beaches and try to restore Eaton's Neck's badly eroded western shoreline back to health.

Board Reports:

Frank B reported that the VG bulkhead is very near 100% completion. Capping remains to be done and some clean-up of cement blocks on the easement needs to happen.

September is the time of the year we look to form a nominating committee to organize a new slate of candidates for our board positions. Frank described the volunteer opportunities on the

warding and an excellent way to give back to the community. "None of these positions require an exorbitant amount of time; just time needed to care about where you live and the people that are here." Please get in-

volved in these next few months.

Nora was not at the meeting and unable to provide a treasurer's report at the meeting, however it is reprinted on pg. 2 of this issue. Frank reported that no unusual expenses were encountered but that POENB has started to make payments on the notes received. The budget was held to firmly for the wall re-build project.

Open camp out & sunset at the grove was discussed. (addendum: Since the meeting, there have been two designated camp out night at the Price's Bend. Sunset at the Grove continues Friday Nights at 7 through August).

A member introduced herself and indicated her daughter, who uses a wheelchair, was unable to access our beach at Price's Bend because the gate on Birmingham has too large of a drop for a wheelchair to negotiate. Also, she noted, travel through the sand on a wheelchair is difficult without a mat (similar to the ones they have at Fire island and over at Hobart). We thanked her for bringing this to our attention and indicated we would investigate ways to make our beaches more accessible.

A member thanked the board for the overall seeing through to completion of the VG bulkhead re-build project. The board was thanked for recognizing the need, overseeing the design & permitting process, contractor selection (then re-selection!), creative financing & timely completion. Franked thanked Steve Neuf for his dedication & oversight.

Julie recognized the overwhelming response from the community to help with the financing. This was true testament to the close connection our members have to our community.

Membership Update:

Gene stepped up to report that as of the morning of the meeting, the membership count was at 243. However, someone had since renewed their



membership online giving us an amended total of 244 which is then the highest count Gene has recorded since he began collecting the member-

ships back in 2014. We have a number of new residents on the Neck this year and we thank all that have joined the POENB. Every single member is needed and we cannot serve and improve our community without membership, so thanks to all for investing in the place we call home. Gene

went on to say that at this time of the year he is often questioned by residents "Did I send in my membership?" He urges all to check their



bank records to see if they renewed but if they remain unsure, to feel free to shoot him at email at membership@eatonsneck.org.

We adjourned at approximately 8:15 PM. Our next meeting is scheduled for September 10th.






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
