Treasurer's Report:

Nora indicated our budget will be presented at our January meeting and voted on in February.

As of our Dec meeting, we had a year-to-date total operating income of \$54,004.43 and year-to-date total operating expenses of \$40,681.23. As of 12/3/21 this left an operating surplus of \$13,323.20. At the time of the report, landscaping fees were still outstanding as was the December issue of the changing Tides. We still had some income to collect from Changing Tides advertising and sail craft storage.

During the month we paid beach expenses and bond repayments. Additional 2021 expenses to pay include Changing Tides printing, landscaping and bond repayments. Our bond repayments are \$276.24 per month.

After paying all remaining expenses, we expect to end the year with a projected surplus around \$8k net. This is less than usual but excess monies we had this year went to building the VG wall. Additionally, Covid's stop on social events and lim-



EATON'S NECK FIRE DEPARTMENT

Please remember to dial 9 1 1 in the event of a fire or medical emergency. This is the fastest way to have the fire department respond to your location. Please be sure that your address is visible in order to assist the first responders. If the emergency occurs during darkness, turn on lights throughout the house for easy identification of your location.

The winter season is fraught with fire situations. The use of space heaters, wood and coal stoves and fireplaces increases the chance of fire and accumulation of Carbon Monoxide (CO). Please practice safe use of these devices while keeping warm. Ensure your safety with a gift of a new smoke alarm and CO detector for the heating season.

The department continues to train for emergency situations as covid transitions from one strain to another. The department follows all state guidelines in practicing responses to medical emergencies. The department also participated in Cardiopulmonary resuscitation training offered by the American Heart Association. This hands-on training took place at the firehouse on Sunday, November 21.

Also, In November a number of members and officers took the Emergency Vehicle Operations course at the Suffolk County Fire Training Academy in Yaphank. This course emphasizes the serious nature of operating emergency vehicles, legal issues and the law as it applies to emergency vehicle operation by volunteers as well as the need for caution in all circumstances

Please help volunteers by reducing your speed at and near the scene of any emergency situation in the community.

A final comment for 2021 is for Chief Steven Zulawski as he steps down after leading the department through three difficult years rather than the normal two-year term of office. His term was fraught with pandemic limits, implementing state guidelines, dealing with new and different conditions for responding to emergencies with a limited number of personnel, getting scarce resources and leading the department through a major change and upgrade of radio communication. His leadership was intelligent, thoughtful, measured, and calm throughout the uncharted situations produced by the covid pandemic.

"A Taste of History" for the Holidays

Isabelle Mary Dann was born in 1857 in Roscrea, County Tipperary, Ireland to Quaker parents, Isaac and Mary. When Isabelle fell in love with the Catholic boy who lived across the street, Cornelius Quinlan, her parents forbid the marriage. So, the couple eloped and ran away to America in 1881 with only \$28 in their pockets.

They first went to Brooklyn to live with an uncle and Cornelius found employment on the August Belmont estate working with the racehorses. Cornelius had a wonderful way with animals, and was offered a job as Superintendent of Beacon Farm on Eaton's Neck and Isabelle was a cook and helped manage the farm as well.

They raised their seven children on the farm, who also went to work there. The Quinlan's lived and worked on Beacon Farm for 30 years, until they retired in 1911 to a house on Vernon Valley Road.

Isabelle left behind her ledger of daily activities on Beacon Farm and contained within are many of her recipes for things such as fruit cake, buttermilk biscuits, pot roast and piano polish!

Perhaps you would like to have a taste of history and create a new tradition with your family by baking Isabelle's cookies:

"Isabelle Dann Quinlan's Gingerbread Cookies"

Heat to boiling point:

- ½ cup molasses
- Turn down heat to medium and add: ¼ cup sugar
- 3 tablespoons of butter
- 1 tablespoon of milk

Mix until sugar is dissolved, and keep warm.

Sift together:

- 2 cups flour
- ½ teaspoon of baking soda
- ½ teaspoon of nutmeg
- ½ teaspoon of cinnamon
- ½ teaspoon of powdered cloves
- ½ teaspoon of powdered ginger

Pour a small amount of wet ingredients into the dry ingredients, mix, then repeat until all ingredients are combined. Roll out the dough and use cookie cutters in shapes of your choice.

Bake for 8-10 minutes @ 375 degrees.

Let cool, then use icing to decorate.

All watercraft need be removed now. Thank you.

The POENB Board has spent a lot of time trying to re organize our watercraft system so that those who need a spot will have the ability to request one as part of their membership. For the convenience of all, we allow the assigned spot to be occupied for two years. Every two years, however, all craft within our membership allotment system (kayaks dinghy's, paddleboards) must be brought home so the racks can be inspected, maintenance performed and spots re shuffled to prevent squatting. This biennial re-organization makes the system as equitable for a family who moved in four months ago one who's been here for forty years.

2022 will be a watercraft re assign year. Spots were supposed to have been vacated by December 1. The board is making sure that owners are given every opportunity to understand the rules and remove their craft now. Shortly we need to go in, cut locks and remove boats from the racks. As you might guess, we have things we'd rather be doing on a freezing winter weekend so please do us the courtesy managing your own property. POENB beaches belong to the community; they are not used car lots or dumping grounds. If you purchase a boat, it must be with the understanding that the only permanent storage for it is at your house.

Those who have sail craft down at the beach must also remove those. Sail craft spots are by lottery, limited in number and granted seasonally, not every two years. All sail craft, hobie or mini, must be now be brought home. We appreciate that moving watercraft is not always easy, however the logistics must be handled by the homeowner. Please reach out to friends and family for assistance.

We will continue to improve the system in 2022. Your cooperation makes it possible.





Dear Friends and Neighbors,



Dear Friends of Eaton's Neck




